


PACIFISM an introductory perspective

PACIFISM AND PHILOSOPHY

The title of Huxley's classic book 'Ends & Means' describes the core of pacifism - 'Can good ends be achieved by bad means?': can, for example the death of children, amongst the most common casualties of war, be justified on any grounds? Here is a challenge to apologists of war who claim it is a moral means to an end. But the rhetoric of war, as the apparent imperative to prepare for war with all the jobs and family comfort that making and selling guns and bullets provide, crowds out this simple question, lest we are discomfited by our answer. Over 100 million warrelated deaths later the truth of Huxley's views is felt by more and more people today.




WOMEN AND PEACE

SAYING NO TO VIOLENCE children and peace

Violence is a heavily-charged and deeply political concept. Its meaning, its causes, and ways to prevent it are all hotly debated. Saying No looks at what 'violence' might mean, and suggests practical and positive ways for parents and teachers of young children to come to grips with this contentious and essentially complex issue.

It shows how, if we want a less violent and more peaceful world, we must develop a positive vision of that world and provide our children with real hope that such a world is possible; it argues that we need to develop nonviolent social values that can bring this new world about. Saying No locates some of the influences which condition our values and our understanding of violence within the cultural, political and economic system and encourages critical examination of how culture and society expose children to violence.



Original letters, court-martial statements, diaries and various documents bring their story of resistance to life.



VOICES FOR PEACE interactive CD



War and violent conflict have complex origins and uncertain outcomes. These are explored side by side with up-to-date information about the state of the world at war.

Maps, graphics and illustrations help to make the issues clear to adults and students alike.

The CD also looks at the experiences and attitudes of the men who in



the First World War refused to fight - often at great cost to themselves.

Despite some being 'crucified' on barbed wire fences in France, and even sentenced to death, they steadfastly refused to put on a uniform and fight. Young men around the world today con-

tinue to be forced to fight, and those who refuse are often imprisoned.

The CD tells of the commitment of millions throughout the world who are trying to make it a less violent place.
